He left the Canary Islands on December 12 and is set to finish in Antigua on Valentine's Day. Frank, halfway through his 3,000-mile adventure, has raised £550,000 of his £1million target for Alzheimer's Research UK. He was on The Island with Bear Grylls in 2017.

My password hell of £221m Bitcoin stash

A COMPUTER expert faces losing £221million of Bitcoin after forgetting the password to his account.

Programmer Stefan Thomas was last night mulling over offers to help him crack the code.

He has wrongly used eight of 10 "IronKey" attempts to get access to his 7,002 Bitcoin. The account will be blocked after two more failed bids.

Internet experts have said they can help, for a cut of his fortune. One, Alex Stamos, claims he can crack a password by "finding a side-channel" in the IronKey.

He added: "I'll make it happen for 10%."

Stefan, who lives in San Francisco, said of his plight: "I would just lay in bed and think about it."

War hero's sleeping bag donated to fundraiser Max, 11

A SCHOOLBOY who has been living in a tent for 10 months to raise money for charity has been given a sleeping bag which belonged to a soldier who died in Afghanistan.

Max Woosey, 11, has camped out for more than 270 days in memory of two family friends, raising nearly £150,000 for a local hospice.

He was inspired after neighbour Rick gave him a tent before he died of cancer in 2019. Rick, 74, told Max to have an adventure with

it so he erected it in his family's garden, hoping to raise £100. He only goes inside to eat, wash and do home-schooling in Braunton, Devon.

Max has now been given a special military sleeping bag by Lisa Snow. It belonged to her son Joe Berry, who died in Afghanistan last February, two weeks before he was due home.

Private Berry, from the 2nd Battalion of the Parachute Regiment in Colchester, died from "non-battle injuries" in Kabul. Lisa said Joe also

enjoyed camping when he was younger and said Max's story "instantly reminded me of Joe", adding: "There were so many similarities that I felt it would be nice to reach out and help."

Max said: "I'm very proud of my new sleeping bag. It's helping me get through the cold months. It's freezing out here. I'll do a year - my last night will be March 26, but knowing me I'll carry on and do more than a year." Mum Rachael added: "Max loves it."
