Basketball training and fixtures. Funding for coaching, transport, matches, awards.	£749.50 £260.00 Total: £1009.50	This has been open to children Years 4, 5 and 6. Weekly attendance has been between 22 and 36 children. As well as providing specific skills and exercise, the matches have required a competitive quality and edge. Feedback from parents has been 100% positive. Several children have joined external basketball clubs.
Handball coaching.	£875.00	A professional coach has been in school to provide training for KS2. As a result the children have learnt to play a new sport. This will lead to competitions in the next academic year.
Gymnastics club.	£450.00	The club has focused on KS1 children. 46 children have taken part. As a result a number of children have joined external clubs. Children have learnt new skills, and feedback from parents has been very positive.
Yoga club.	£575.00	A TA attended a weekend training course, which qualified her to teach yoga in school. As a result all KS2 classes have had yoga lessons, as well as a club.
Purchase of yoga mats.	£143.84	Yoga mats for above club.
Purchase of rebound nets.	£119.96	Nets purchased to use in PE, and to improve catching skills.

Sports equipment.	£5,000	Equipment used In PE lessons.
Football Association.	£45.00	Subs for membership of the School Football Association. Children took part in two leagues.
Tennis equipment.	£59.84	Purchase of tennis balls and markers to support clubs and curriculum.
Focused PPA time to observe other PE lessons.	£660.00	Release time for staff to observe good practice, allowing them to remodel their own teaching.
Awards and medals.	£100.00	To celebrate sporting achievements at end of year.
Mile a Day resources and awards.	£500.00	As part of our health and well being initiative, we introduced a mile a day, aiming to improve physical health.
